Luke 15:1-2

"Now all the tax collectors and the sinners were coming near Him to listen to Him. ² Both the **Pharisees and the scribes** began to grumble, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them."

Read Luke 15:11-24 "The Parable of the Man With Two Sons" (part 1)

Q: When the Father calls for a banquet to celebrate, who is the party for?

neighbors to do?	

Read Luke 15:25-32 "The Parable of the Man With Two Sons" part 2)
