People were bringing little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them, but the disciples rebuked them. ¹⁴ When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. ¹⁵ Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." ¹⁶ And he took the children in his arms, placed his hands on them and blessed them. Children are a gift from the Lord. Babies are a reward.

Grandchildren are the crown of the aged... Proverbs 17:6 (ESV)

Why should children matter to me?

1. Because children matter in heaven.

"Be careful. Don't think these little children are worth nothing. I tell you that they have angels in heaven who are always with my Father in heaven."

Matthew 18:10 (ICB)

2. Because children are closely connected to God.

Jesus knew what they were thinking. So he took a little child and stood the child beside him. ⁴⁸ Then Jesus said, "If anyone accepts a little child like this in my name, then he accepts me. And when he accepts me, he accepts the One who sent me. He who is least among you all—he is the greatest."

Luke 9:47-48 (ICB)

3. Because children are godly role models.

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me. Don't stop them, because the kingdom of heaven belongs to people who are like these children."

Matthew 19:14 (ICB)

He called a little child to him, and placed the child among them.

³ And he said: "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

⁴ Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven."

Matthew 18:2-4 (NIV)

2. Bring children with me to church.

3. Pray for children.

4. <u>Direct children toward God</u>.

Some people brought children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them... Mark 10:13 (NIV)

Then Jesus took the children in his arms. He put his hands on them and blessed them.
