Open Doors in Acts

"On arriving there, they gathered the church together and reported all that God had done through them and how **he had opened a door of faith** to the Gentiles."

Acts 14:27 (NIV)

"Paul and his companions traveled throughout the region of Phrygia and Galatia, having been kept by the Holy Spirit from preaching the word in the province of Asia. 7 When they came to the border of Mysia, they tried to enter Bithynia, but the Spirit of Jesus would not allow them to. 8 So they passed by Mysia and went down to Troas. 9 During the night Paul had a vision of a man of Macedonia standing and begging him, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." 10 After Paul had seen the vision, we got ready at once to leave for Macedonia, concluding that God had called us to preach the gospel to them."

Paul talked about those open doors

"But I will stay on at Ephesus until Pentecost, ⁹ because **a great door for effective work has opened to me**, and there are many who oppose me."

1Cor. 16:8-9 (NIV)

"Now when I went to Troas to preach the gospel of Christ and found that the Lord had opened a door for me..."

2Cor. 2:12 (NIV)

"Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful.

3 And pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. 4 Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should.

1. I am eager to do good.

"..., Jesus Christ, ¹⁴ who gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and **to purify for himself a people** that are his very own, **eager to do what is good**."

2. I am wise enough to be winsome.

A Simple definition of Winsome: Cheerful, Pleasant, & Appealing

"Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. 6 Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone."

Col. 4:5-6 (NIV)
