

Rule #1: When God Leads Me To Difficulty Red Sea Rules #1 Tim Gill - October 28, 2018

Then the LORD said to Moses, ² "Tell the Israelites to turn back and encamp near Pi Hahiroth, between Migdol and the sea. They are to encamp by the sea, directly opposite Baal Zephon.

Exodus 14:1-2 (NIV)

What do I do when life gets difficult?

1. I Believe God brings me to it.

Then the LORD said to Moses, ² "Tell the Israelites to <u>turn back and</u> <u>encamp near Pi Hahiroth, between Migdol and the sea</u>. They are to encamp by the sea, directly opposite Baal Zephon. ³ Pharaoh will think, 'The Israelites are wandering around the land in confusion, hemmed in by the desert.' ⁴ And I will harden Pharaoh's heart, and he will pursue them. But I will gain glory for myself through Pharaoh and all his army, and the Egyptians will know that I am the LORD." <u>So the Israelites did this</u>. **Exodus 14:1-4 (NIV)**

Friends, when life gets really difficult, <u>don't jump to the conclusion that</u> <u>God isn't on the job</u>. Instead, be glad that you are in the very thick of what Christ experienced. This is a spiritual <u>refining process</u>, with glory just around the corner. **1 Peter 4:12-13 (MSG)**

God brings me to difficulty *for my preparation*!

- My difficulties <u>will reveal my weakness</u>. (Psalm 106:7) Question: <u>What weakness does my difficulty reveal</u>?
- My difficulties <u>will shape my character</u>. (Romans 5:1-5) Question: <u>What is God trying to develop in me</u>?
- My difficulties <u>can strengthen my faith</u>. (Hebrews 5:8)
 Question: <u>Where do I need to trust God 'again</u>'?
- My difficulties <u>offer moments to glorify God</u>. (Philippians 1:12) Question: <u>Does my response to difficulty promote the gospel</u>?

2. I Believe God is with me while I'm in it.

The LORD showed them the way; during the day he went ahead of them in a pillar of cloud, and during the night he was in a pillar of fire to give them light...²² The pillar of cloud was always with them during the day, and the pillar of fire was always with them at night. **Exodus 13:21-22 (NCV)**

You will leave Babylon, but they will not force you to leave in a hurry. You will not be forced to run away. The Lord will be in front of you. The God of Israel will be behind you. Isaiah 52:12 (ERV)

I look behind me and you're there, then up ahead and you're there, too— your reassuring presence, coming and going. This is too much, too wonderful— I can't take it all in! **Psalm 139:5-6 (MSG)**

3. I Believe God will lead me through it.

Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and all that night the LORD drove the sea back with a strong east wind and turned it into dry land. The waters were divided, ²² and the Israelites went through the sea on dry ground, with a wall of water on their right and on their left. **Exodus 14:21-22 (NIV)**

Your road led through the sea, your pathway through the mighty waters— <u>a pathway no one knew was there</u>! **Psalm 77:19 (NLT)**

This is what the Lord says. He is the one who made a road through the sea. <u>Even through rough waters he made a path for his people</u>. Isaiah 43:19 (ICB)

The men were amazed. They said, "What kind of man is this? <u>Even</u>the wind and the sea obey him!"Matthew 8:27 (ICB)

I will bring them back from Egypt and gather them from Assyria. I will bring them to Gilead and Lebanon, and there will not be room enough for them. ¹¹ <u>They will pass through the sea of trouble</u>; the surging sea will be subdued and all the depths of the Nile will dry up. Assyria's pride will be brought down and Egypt's scepter will pass away. ¹² I will strengthen them in the LORD and in his name they will live securely," declares the LORD.
