Think about the <u>things above</u> and not <u>things on earth</u>. Colossians 3:2 (CEB)

Brothers and sisters, think about [focus your thoughts on; <u>fill your</u> <u>minds with</u>] <u>things that are true</u> and <u>honorable</u> and <u>right</u> [just] and <u>pure</u> and <u>beautiful</u> [lovely] and <u>respected</u> [commendable]. If there is anything that is <u>good</u> [morally excellent] and <u>worthy of praise</u>, <u>think</u> <u>about</u> [focus your thoughts on; <u>fill your minds with</u>] these things. **Philippians 4:8 (EXB)**

Where do thoughts like these come from?

- I can't rely on *my culture*.
- I can't rely on *my customs*.
- I can't rely on *my reason*.
- I can't rely on my emotions.
- I can rely on God's Word.

As for God, his way is perfect: <u>The Lord's word is flawless</u>. Psalm 18:30a (NIV)

I haven't wandered away from the commands that He has spoken; <u>I've treasured what he has said more than my own meals</u>.

Job 23:12 (ISV)

How do I fill my mind with what is true?

1. Receive God's Word.

So after <u>getting rid</u> of all moral filthiness and overflowing wickedness, <u>receive with humility the word planted in you</u>.

James 1:21a (EHV)

The wicked people are <u>too proud</u>. They do not look for God. <u>There</u> is **no room** for God in their thoughts.

Psalm 10:4 (ICB)

It is senseless to pay tuition to educate a rebel who has <u>no heart for</u> <u>truth</u>.

Proverbs 17:16 (TLB)

My <u>attitude</u> determines my <u>aptitude</u>.

Lead me by your truth and teach me, for you are the God who saves me. All day long I put my hope in you.

Psalm 25:5 (NLT)

2. <u>Read God's Word</u>.

Open my eyes to see the <u>wonderful truths</u> in your instructions. Psalm 119:18 (NLT)

Psalm 119:162 (NLT) But the truly happy people are those who <u>carefully study God's</u> <u>perfect law</u> that makes people free, and <u>they continue to study it</u>. They do not forget what they heard, but they obey what God's teaching says. Those who do this will be made happy. James 1:25 (NCV)

4. Reflect on God's Word.
