Run from anything that gives you the <u>evil thoughts</u> that young men often have, but <u>stay close</u> to anything that makes you want to do right.

2 Timothy 2:22a (TLB)

...fill your minds with those things that are good and that deserve praise: things that are true, noble, right, pure, lovely, and honorable.

Philippians 4:8 (GNT)

Why should I focus on things that are honorable?

1. Honorable thoughts *give me security* in bad circumstances.

Think about the <u>things above</u> and not <u>things on earth</u>.

Colossians 3:2 (CEB)

An honorable man makes honorable plans; his honorable character gives him security.

Isaiah 32:8 (NET)

LORD, remember my suffering and my misery, my sorrow and trouble... ²¹ But I have hope when I think of this: ²² The LORD's love never ends; his mercies never stop. ²³ They are new every morning; LORD, your loyalty is great. ²⁴ I say to myself, "The LORD is mine, so I hope in him." ²⁵ The LORD is good to those who hope in him, to those who seek him. ²⁶ It is good to wait quietly for the LORD to save.

Lamentations 3:19, 21-26 (NCV)

- 2. Honorable thoughts *change how I treat others*.
 - The Christian life is measured by how I treat others.

When Jesus stepped out of the boat, he saw a large crowd. His heart went out to them...

Mark 6:34a (EHV)

<u>Honor everyone</u>. Love the family of believers. Have respectful fear of God. Honor the emperor.

1 Peter 2:17 (CEB)

God wants me to honor...

- <u>God</u> & <u>His word</u>: Ecclesiastes 12:13, Proverbs 3:9, Revelation 4:11
- My parents: Exodus 20:12-13, Ephesians 6:2-3
- My spouse: Ephesians 5:3, 1 Peter 3:7-8
- <u>God's Family</u>: 1 Corinthians 12:1, Timothy 5:17, Philippians 2:29, Romans 12:10,13:7, Hebrews 13:17, 1 Thessalonians 5:12
- Older people: Leviticus 19:32, 1 Timothy 5:1
- Unbelievers: 1 Peter 3:15-16

Use your heads as you live and work among outsiders. Don't miss a trick. Make the most of every opportunity. Be gracious in your speech. The goal is to bring out the best in others in a conversation, not put them down, not cut them out.

Colossians 4:5-6 (MSG)

- The *poor*: Proverbs 14:31, 19:17
- Immigrants: Leviticus 19:33-34

Do not mistreat foreigners living in your country, ³⁴ but treat them just as you treat your own citizens. Love foreigners as you love yourselves, <u>because you were foreigners one time in Egypt</u>. I am the LORD your God.

Leviticus 19:33-34 (NCV)

- My enemies: Matthew 5:44-47
- Government Leaders: Romans 13:1, 1 Peter 2:17
- 3. Honorable thoughts *keep my focus on God's purpose*.

But Jesus turned and told Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are an offense to me, because you are not thinking <u>God's</u> thoughts but <u>human thoughts!"</u>

Matthew 16:23 (ISV)

<u>The gospel</u> is the honorable thought of a believer.

I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who has given me strength to do <u>his work</u>. He considered me trustworthy and <u>appointed me</u> <u>to serve him</u>, ¹³ even though I used to blaspheme the name of Christ. In my insolence, I persecuted his people. <u>But God had mercy on me</u> because I did it in ignorance and unbelief. ¹⁴ Oh, <u>how generous and gracious our Lord was!</u> He filled me with the faith and love that come from Christ Jesus.

1 Timothy 1:12-14 (NLT)

This is a trustworthy saying, and everyone should accept it:
"Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners"—and I am
the worst of them all. ¹⁶ But God had mercy on me so that Christ
Jesus could use me as a prime example of his great patience
with even the worst sinners. Then others will realize that they,
too, can believe in him and receive eternal life.
