- ... by <u>affluence</u>.
- ... by *achievement*.
- ... by <u>approval</u>.

He entered Jericho and was passing through.² And there was a man called by the name of Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and he was rich.³ Zacchaeus was trying to see who Jesus was, and was unable because of the crowd, for he was small in stature.⁴ So he ran on ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree in order to see Him, for He was about to pass through that way. ⁵ When Jesus came to the place, He looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down, for today I must stay at your house." ⁶ And he hurried and came down and received Him gladly. ⁷ When they saw it, they all began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to be the guest of a man who is a sinner."⁸ Zacchaeus stopped and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, half of my possessions I will give to the poor, and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I will give back four times as much."⁹ And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he, too, is a son of Abraham. ¹⁰ "For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost." Luke 19:1-10 (NIV)

1. No matter how small I feel, Jesus notices me. (v.5a)

When Jesus came by, <u>he looked up at Zacchaeus</u> and called him by name. Luke 19:5 (NLT)

• The greatest way to express love *is by giving attention*.

God <u>never overlooks</u> a single sparrow. <u>And He pays even greater</u> <u>attention to you</u>, down to the last detail- even numbering the hairs on your head! Luke 12:6-7 (MSG)

2. No matter who *ignores me*, Jesus *knows* me. (v.5)

• He calls Zacchaeus by name.

When Jesus came by, he looked up at Zacchaeus and called him by name. Luke 19:5 (NLT)

• Zacchaeus means *pure one*.

Yet Jerusalem says, "The LORD has deserted us; the Lord has forgotten us." ¹⁵ "Never! Can a mother forget her nursing child? Can she feel no love for a child she has borne? But even if that were possible, I would not forget you! ¹⁶ See, I have <u>written **your name** on</u> <u>my hand</u>. Isaiah 49:14-16 (NLT)

3. No matter what *<u>l've done</u>*, Jesus <u>wants me</u>. (v.5)

When Jesus got there, he looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, hurry down! I want to stay with you today." Luke 19:5 (CEV)

• God is interested in *<u>changing</u>* me not *<u>condemning</u>* me.

4. No matter what <u>others say</u>, <u>Jesus affirms me</u>. (v.7-9)

But the people were displeased. "He has gone to be the guest of a notorious sinner," they grumbled. Luke 19:7 (NLT)

Meanwhile, Zacchaeus stood before the Lord and said, "<u>I will give</u> half my wealth to the poor, Lord, and if I have cheated people on their taxes, <u>I will give</u> them back four times as much!"⁹ Jesus responded, "Salvation has come to this home today, for this man has shown himself to be a true son of Abraham. ¹⁰ For the Son of Man^[a] came to seek and save those who are lost." Luke 19:8-9 (NLT)

Zacchaeus <u>scrambled</u> out of the tree, hardly believing his good luck, <u>delighted to take Jesus home with him</u>. Luke 19:6 (MSG)

• Response: Zacchaeus *takes Jesus home*.

Jesus replied, "Anyone who loves me will obey my teaching. My Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them." John 14:23 (NIV)
