Handling Opposition To My Faith

God blesses those people who are treated badly for doing right.

They belong to the kingdom of heaven.

Matthew 5:10 (CEV)

God blesses you when people mock you and persecute you and lie about you and say all sorts of evil things against you because you are my followers. ¹² Be happy about it! Be very glad! For a great reward awaits you in heaven. And remember, the ancient prophets were persecuted in the same way.

Matthew 5:11-12 (NLT)

What do I need to 'remember' when my faith is opposed?

- 1. I remember that opposition *is normal for the godly*.
- 2. I remember that opposition confirms I'm more like Jesus.
- 3. I remember that opposition will strengthen my faith.
- **4.** I remember that opposition <u>can be rewarding</u>.

What do I 'do' when my faith is opposed?

1. I refuse to be afraid.

Where God's love is, there is no fear, because God's perfect love takes away fear.

1 John 4:18 (ERV)

But even if you suffer for doing what is right, God will reward you for it. So don't worry or be afraid of their threats. ¹⁵ Instead, you must worship Christ as Lord of your life. 1 Peter 3:14-15 (NLT)

2. I refuse to be ashamed.

However, if you suffer as a Christian, do not be ashamed, but praise God that you bear that name.

1 Peter 4:16 (NIV)

People today are so sinful. They have not been faithful to God. As you live among them, don't be ashamed of me and my teaching. If that happens, I will be ashamed of you when I come with the glory of my Father and the holy angels."

Mark 8:38 (ERV)

3. I recognize the source: Satan

Be careful—watch out for attacks from Satan, your great enemy. He prowls around like a hungry, roaring lion, looking for some victim to tear apart.

1 Peter 5:8 (TLB)

For we are not fighting against human beings but against the wicked spiritual forces in the heavenly world, the rulers, authorities, and cosmic powers of this dark age. Ephesians 6:12 (GNT)

4. I <u>rely</u> on <u>God's justice</u>.

5. I <u>respond</u> with a <u>blessing</u>.

Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Romans 12:21 (NIV)

Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, ²⁸ bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. ²⁹ If someone slaps you on one cheek, turn to them the other also. **Luke 6:27-29 (NIV)**
