Christmas <u>celebrates</u> God <u>bringing his presence to earth</u>.

A virgin will become pregnant and give birth to a son, and she will name him Immanuel [God Is With Us]. Isaiah 7:14 (GW)

God's presence is the <u>one thing</u> that gives me <u>everything</u>.

Why did God come to earth on Christmas?

1. God came to earth because He doesn't want me to be alone.

A virgin will have a baby boy, and he will be called Immanuel, which means God is with us.

Matthew 1:23 (CEV)

2. God came to earth to make a difference in my life.

This very day in David's town your Savior was born—Christ the Lord!

Luke 2:11 (GNT)

You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. Luke 1:31-32a (NIV)

- He comes with <u>greatness</u>: He is <u>the Son of God!</u>
 - Nothing remains the same in God's presence!

They hurried to the village and found Mary and Joseph. And there was the baby, lying in the manger. ¹⁷ After seeing him, the shepherds told everyone what had happened and what the angel had said to them about this child. ¹⁸ All who heard the shepherds' story were astonished, ¹⁹ but **Mary** kept all these things in her heart and thought about them often. ²⁰ The shepherds went back to their flocks, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, ³³ and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end.

Luke 1:32b-33 (NIV)

Christmas is about the *lordship* of Jesus.

He came to the world that was his own. And his own people did not accept him.

John 1:11 (ERV)

3. God came on Christmas to die for me.

But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. ¹¹ Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord.

Luke 2:10-11 (NIV)
