

## The 5 Levels Of Discipling Relationships

There are 5 levels of relationships in every disciple's life...

Level #5: My relationships with the crowds. (Ex: The World)

Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, <sup>2</sup> and he began to teach them.

Matthew 5:1-2 (NIV)

And what pity he felt for the crowds that came, because their problems were so great and they didn't know what to do or where to go for help. They were like sheep without a shepherd. <sup>37</sup> "The harvest is so great, and the workers are so few," he told his disciples. <sup>38</sup> "So pray to the one in charge of the harvesting, and ask him to recruit more workers for his harvest fields."

Matthew 9:36-38 (TLB)

**Level #4: My relationships** *in my church*. (Ex: The 500 & The 72)

I'd say half of the most impactful people I know, who love Jesus and tear up at the mention of His name, who reach out to the poor and lonely and are fundamentally sound in their theology, who create institutions that feed hundreds of thousands, do not attend a traditional church service. Many of them even speak at churches, but they have no home church and don't long for one.

Level #3: My relationships in my small group. (Ex: The 12)

Then Jesus went up on a mountain and called to him those he wanted, and they came to him. Jesus chose twelve and called them apostles. He wanted them to be with him, and he wanted to send

them out to preach <sup>15</sup> and to have the authority to force demons out of people. <sup>16</sup> These are the twelve men he chose: Simon (Jesus named him Peter), <sup>17</sup> James and John, the sons of Zebedee <sup>18</sup> Andrew, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James the son of Alphaeus, Thaddaeus, Simon the Zealot, <sup>19</sup> and Judas Iscariot, who later turned against Jesus. Mark 3:13-19 (NCV)

Who is at this level?
Level #2: My relationship with my closest godly friends. (Ex: The 3)
Six days later, Jesus took Peter, James, and John, the brother of James, up on a high mountain by themselves. Matthew 17:1 (NCV)
Jesus let only Peter, James, and John the brother of James go with him.  Mark 5:37 (NCV)
Jesus and his followers went to a place called Gethsemane. He said to them, "Sit here while I pray." He took Peter, James, and John with him and began to be filled with horror and deepest distress. 34 And he said to them, "My soul is crushed by sorrow to the point of death; stay here and watch with me."  Mark 14:32-34 (TLB)
Who is at this level?
Level #1: My relationship <u>with my mentor</u> . (Ex: John)  Jesus' favorite disciple was sitting next to him at the meal.  John 13:23 (CEV)
When Jesus saw his mother and his favorite disciple with her, he said to his mother, "This man is now your son." John 19:26 (CEV)
