Matt. 16:13-14

Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, He was asking His disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" ¹⁴ And they said, "Some say John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; but still others, Jeremiah, or one of the prophets."

(NASB)

Q: How did the people fail to get a grip on Jesus?

John 5:36-47

"But the testimony which I have is greater than the testimony of John; for the works which the Father has given Me to accomplish — the very works that I do — testify about Me, that the Father has sent Me. 37 "And the Father who sent Me. He has testified of Me. You have neither heard His voice at any time nor seen His form. 38 "You do not have His word abiding in you, for you do not believe Him whom He sent. 39 "You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; it is these that testify about Me; 40 and you are unwilling to come to Me so that you may have life. 41 "I do not receive glory from men; 42 but I know you, that you do not have the love of God in yourselves. 43 " have come in My Father's name, and you do not receive Me; if another comes in his own name, you will receive him. 44 "How can you believe, when you receive glory from one another and you do not seek the glory that is from the one and only God? 45 "Do not think that I will accuse you before the Father; the one who accuses you is Moses, in whom you have set your hope. 46 "For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me, for he wrote about Me. ⁴⁷ "But if you do not believe his writings, how will you believe My words?"

(NASB)

- 1. They didn't understand what Jesus was really doing (vs. 36). He was working for God's Kingdom, not theirs!
- 2. They didn't have the Word of God in them (vs. 37).

 You can spend time reading the Bible and not take it in...

 Application leads to transformation!

- 3. They didn't really love God (vs. 42). They didn't want what God wants!
- 4. They did things to get glory from each other, not God (vs. 44). Being seen as righteous can become more important than actually being righteous!

Matt. 16:15-17

He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" ¹⁶ Simon Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." ¹⁷ And Jesus said to him, "Blessed are you, Simon Barjona, because flesh and blood did not reveal this to you, but My Father who is in heaven.

(NASB)

Because Peter got a grip on Jesus, he saw Him for who He really is!

- "You are the Christ" (vs. 16)
 The Christ is the one who has been anointed King.
- 2. "The Son of the Living God" (vs. 16)

 Being God's Son is Not about Paternity... it's about being
 God's image and ruling for God.
