"And you were dead in the trespasses and sins ² in which you once walked, following the course of this world, ... ⁴ But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, ⁵ even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved— ⁶ and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, ... ¹⁰ For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."

Eph. 2:1-2, 4-6, 10 (ESV)

"... we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, ¹⁰ so as to **walk in a manner worthy of the Lord**, fully pleasing to him, bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God;"

Col. 1:9-10 (ESV)

What does a walk that is worthy of the Lord look like?

"I therefore, ..., urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, ² with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, ³ eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."

Eph. 4:1-3 (ESV)

What does a walk worthy of your calling look like?

Your brothers and sisters will never be worthy of you walking this way; but Jesus is!

walk as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their minds... ²⁵ "Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another. ²⁶ Be angry and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, ²⁷ and give no opportunity to the devil. ²⁸ Let the thief no longer steal, but rather let him labor, doing honest work with his own hands, so that he may have something to share with anyone in need. ²⁹ Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. ³⁰ And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. ³¹ Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. ³² Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, <u>as God in</u> Christ forgave you."

Eph. 4:17, 25-32 (ESV)

Vs. 25 "Put away falsehood" and "Speak the truth".

Q: Why do we lie? We want to control something or someone.

Q: What does the Lord deserve? For us to trust Him, and control ourselves.

Vs. 26 "Be angry and do not sin".

Q: When does anger become a sin? When it lacks humility.

Q: What does the Lord deserve? For me to focus on what He deserves, instead of what I think I deserve.

Vs. 28 Don't steal; instead, work and share.

Q: Why do we steal? Why don't we share? We think providing for ourselves is up to us.

Q: What does the Lord deserve? For me to trust Him to take care of me, and for me to be a good steward.

Vs. 29 Don't say hurtful things; instead, say things that build others up.

Q: Why do we put people down or "in their place"? To elevate ourselves, or because we think God needs our help taking someone down a notch.

Q: What does the Lord deserve? For me to trust Him, humble myself, and consider others as more important than me. (Phil. 2:3)

<u>Vs. 32</u> Put away bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor and slander and replace them with kindness, tenderheartedness, and forgiveness

Q: How can you walk like this?
